
Objectives:

The silent finding from the study are parent behavior towards children was expectation based. However, mother attitude and behavior with child was supportive as compared to father. There was significant impact of family socio-Economic status and child

Thakare Manjusha (2012) studied child relation in light of pre and post independent family life style Data was collected with the help of specially designed questionnaire. The findings of study were during Pre independence era parents to reserve time for child to know about his/her difficulties school activities and requirement which has changed totally during post independent era. Parent do not have time to spend with their child.

Sweta (2016) Parent nature, behavior tension affect the child empowerment Parential stress effects child physical and mental health adversly. It also effect child self confidence and academic achievement.



Research Methodology:

The study was undertaken in seven tahsils of Amravati district. A sample of 560 children and 560 Parent selected for the study from 28 schools. Data was collected by using specially designed questionnaire. Simple tabular analysis method was used to interpret ate finding. Hypothesis:

- 2) Teenager need support and cooperation.
